

Interesting Tour Programmes

2 Days 1 Night at Khao Yai Day 1

● Morning Time : Drive with your family from Bangkok to Khao Yai by passing through either Pak Chong District in Nakhon Ratchasima province or Prachinburi province (the road leading to Khao Yai is open from 6 a.m. till 9 p.m.). Stop by at any food shop in Khao Yai.

● Afternoon Time : Drive to Haew Suwat waterfall, 4 km. from



the National Park Headquarters. Appreciate the wonderful cascade and crystal-clear pond nestled in the verdant forest. Then continue onto Highway No. 3077 to Kilometre to marker 24 and walk for one kilometre to Haew Narok fall, the largest cascade in Khao Yai National Park. Witness the sheer cliff covered with a curtain of running-water rendering a sonorous sound throughout the jungle.

● Evening Time : Cooking on your own. Stay overnight in the provided accommodation. Those who want to stay close to nature can stay in a tent.

● Night Time : Enjoy a night safari by watching wild animals foraging food. Nocturnal animals include Barking Deer, Sambar Deer, Asian Elephant, Common Wild Pig, Small Indian Civet, and Common Palm Civet. Please inform the officials in advance for the night animal-watching activity.

Day 2

● Morning and Afternoon Time : Spend the whole time trekking the 4-kilometer natural trail from Visitor Center to Nong Pak Chee and gleaning a wealth of information about the natural world. The first part of the trail passes evergreen forest, creek, and many many trees. Different kinds of flora and wild birds can be spotted along the way. The final destination is the Nong Phakchi animal-watching location, consisting of marsh and grassland, where large animals like Barking Deer, and Common Wild Pig love to forage for food.

● Evening Time : Take a bath and pack your bags for home. Stop by at any food shops that line the road. And then drive back home safely.

One-day Trip at Kaeng Krachan- Ban Krang Camp

● Morning Time : Drive from Bangkok in the early morning to Kaeng Krachan National Park in the late morning. Stop by to watch the birds and have lunch along the dam.

● Afternoon Time : Visit Ban Krang Camp located at Kilometre Marker 15. Along the way there is a giant banyan tree where many hornbills love to flock from time to time. Ban Krang Camp is nestled in the evergreen forest where a small creek flows through the area. There are a plethora of wild birds and butterflies hovering around the forest. There is a short natural trail too.

● Evening Time : Dining and appreciating the magnificent sunset above the Kaeng Krachan Dam before driving back home.
